PROMOTION CRITERIA

GRADES 1 to 9

1. As there are 2 Periodic tests and two term examinations, a student must get 40% marks in all the subjects.
2. Students who do not obtain minimum 40% in term I and term II will have to answer an improvement exam.
3. Students must maintain a minimum attendance of 75% throughout the academic year to be eligible for promotion.

CODE OF CONDUCT

1. PUNCTUALITY AND REGULARITY

- 1.1 Students are expected to be in the class by 9.00 a.m. and study till 9.15 a.m. followed by School Assembly.
- 1.2 The class teacher will check the school diary and uniform before the assembly.

2. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE RULES

- 2.1 Attendance is compulsory on the following days: Closing and reopening day (Dussehra, Christmas and Summer Vacation), National Festivals, Sports Day, Annual day and other important celebration at school, marked in the school Diary.
- 2.2 Application for leave has to be submitted, in the school diary, if it is for 1-2 days and sanction obtained from the Class Teacher/ Principal. Leave for three days or more has to be sought by the parent in a separate application addressed to the Principal and sanction obtained.
- 2.3 Leave of absence is not granted except on prior written application from parents/guardians in the Leave Record provided in the diary. If the absence exceeds three days, then it must be granted by the principal.

- 2.4 When a student is absent from school without leave for some unforeseen reason, e.g., illness, accident or death of a loved one, he/She, on returning to school, should bring a note of excuse from his/her parents/guardian in the Leave Record (Pg. No. 43) provided in the diary. If a student is absent for more than three days in case of sickness or any other reason, the parent/guardian must inform the school office about the reason of absence and should send the medical certificate for justification.

3. INSTRUCTION TO PARENTS

- 3.1. Students must not grow nails. They must not paint, polish or colour the nails, do eye make-up, wear finger rings display tattoo, funky bands and metal bracelets (kadas)
- 3.2. Usage of Mehendi on special occasions is allowed only with prior permission from the principal.
- 3.3 Students should be encouraged to repack their bags on a daily basis and avoid carrying unnecessary articles, text books, workbooks that are not needed. Children are often in the habit of storing things in their school bags. Therefore, regular cleaning of the school bag is essential.
- 3.4. Parents should see that their children leave their houses in time to be punctual to school and that they are provided with necessary books and stationery and see that they come to the school having completed the work assigned to them.
- 3.5. Parents are requested not to allow children to take Mobile phone, Music player, Videogames, Pen drive, CD, Laptop, Key chains, Fancy rings (both ear rings and finger rings), play cards of different types, bracelets of any kind, Camera, iPods, Digital watches, Nail cutter, Steel ruler, Whitener, Adult books, Magazines or any type of electronic gadgets to the school. The things, once confiscated, will not be returned.
- 3.6. Parents are requested to write the child's name and grade on his/her belongings such as water- bottles, tiffin-carriers, umbrellas, etc.
- 3.7 Based on the directives of WHO (World Health Organization) we have banned bringing and consuming of junk Food of all kinds in the school. We also urge parents to enforce this ban at home and safeguard the health of their children. So please send healthy snacks during short break. (Eg. Home-made food, fruits...)
- 3.8 Parents and students are advised not to give any kind of gifts to the teachers/members of the staff.
- 3.9 Boys must have a decent hair – cut. Growing long hair, wedge cut, mushroom cut and other freaky hair styles are not allowed.
- 3.10 If a student's uniform and hairstyle are not in accordance with the school rules of if a student violates these norms, strict action will be taken against such student.
- 3.11 Circulars/Notices sent to parents must be acknowledged. Parents, when summoned to school, must understand that there is something very important to be discussed with them.
- 3.12 Students are not permitted to bring money to the school, unless there is a clear instruction from the school to bring money for a particular purpose.
- 3.13 Parents shall not come to take children home during school working hours without a serious reason as it disturbs the smooth functioning of the school.
- 3.14 Diary must be checked by parents regularly. Please see if there is any notice or remark given by the teacher and kindly acknowledge it.
- 3.15 Parents have a responsibility to encourage modest, decent and tasteful dressing habits, conforming to the acceptable social norms among children from early stages of their development.

- 3.16 Parents shall take steps to sensitize children on the ill-effects of the excessive use of mobile phones and social media.
- 3.17 If a student contracts chicken pox or any contagious disease, send him/her to school only after it is completely cured and certified by a Qualified Doctor. The school authorities may send back students who are not medically fit to attend the classes.
- 3.18 Parents can avail the service of the school Counselor to discuss the behavioral issues pertaining to their wards with prior appointment during school hours.
- 3.19 Students who wish to join the School Team in any sports games, must attend all the special/ practice sessions conducted by the school. Attendance in this respect is compulsory. Disciplinary code should be strictly followed.
- 3.20 Selection for the school team will be done strictly by the school authority based on performance and discipline. No parent should be involved in this matter. Students are not allowed to play in any team against the school.
- 3.21 Physical Education Teacher will accompany the students only for those tournaments which are approved by the state Government, Department of CBSE & AICS (Association of ICSE and CBSE School). For any Club Sports, Association Sports, private tournaments, the parents should take the responsibility of accompanying their children.

4. PARENTS' VISIT TO SCHOOL

- 4.1 Parents are requested to visit the school for all their transactions only during office hours on working days.
- 4.2 Parents who wish to meet teachers, may do so on every Saturday between 9.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon.
- 4.3 Parents are requested not to interact with the teachers on other days.

- 4.4 Parents visiting School on a working day must go to the School Office and not to Staff rooms or Classrooms.
- 4.5 Parents have any queries please approach to the office or class teacher, if it is about the subject – subject teacher.
- 4.6 Parents, meeting the Principal and teachers at least once in a term will definitely help their child's overall development.

5. UNIFORM/ HAIR STYLE

- 5.1 If a student takes part in any stage programme, the attire should be changed to school uniform soon after the programme.
- 5.2 From Second Term, students must wear Black Shoes as a part of the school uniform. Under unavoidable circumstances, the child may wear black open sandals only.
- 5.3 All girls from Grades 1 to 10 having short hair must wear black hair band/ black ribbons/black clips. Shoulder length hair must be tied in two pony tails and long hair should be braided in two plaits with a middle parting (also rule is applicable during exam and Saturdays). Fringes and side locks are strictly not allowed.
- 5.4 Girls must compulsorily wear slip, shorts of knee length inside the uniform specially pinafore.
- 5.5 Students should be back in full school uniform for the school assembly after their morning sports practice, if any.

6. GENERAL BEHAVIOUR OF STUDENTS

- 6.1 On the teacher's arrival in the classroom, the students must greet the teacher, pray and then take their seats.
- 6.2 Students are not allowed to loiter/stand in the corridors or on the campus during the working hours. They should move from one classroom to another with the permission of the Class Teacher in a disciplined manner without causing disturbance to other classes.

- 6.3 No student will be called to the phone during school hours. However, in case of emergency, the message will be conveyed to them.
- 6.4 Books, umbrellas, tiffin-boxes, etc. should have a name or mark by which they can be identified. All stray and unclaimed property should be brought to the office.
- 6.5 If a student does not complete his/her work/assignments/projects regularly, period detention/P.E. detention could be used by the Principal/ Subject Teacher after initial warning.
- 6.6 Student shall not engage in any sort of malpractice during examinations, if found severe action will be taken.
- 6.7 The school, though not responsible for the conduct of students outside its premises, will take cognizance of any serious misconduct committed outside the school. In any extreme case the final decision will be taken by the principal.
- 6.8 Stealing books, money, or any other articles is forbidden. The student will be asked to pay double the amount of the items stolen.
- 6.9 Students are forbidden to enter the laboratories except with the permission of the teacher-in-charge. All equipment and materials given to students for practical work should be handled with care.
- 6.10 A student may avail medical room facility in case of sickness during class hours. A written note must be brought from the class teacher/subject teacher.
- 6.11 Any student who wishes to be exempted from mass Drill/ Games/ PT must provide an authentic letter from a doctor, stating the problem.
- 6.12 Students are expected to wear their ID card in the school campus falling which a fine will be levied.

- 6.13 Damaging the school property/misuse of smart board is undesirable. A fine will be collected depending on the damages caused.
- 6.14 While going to the Assembly, PT Classes, Labs, washrooms and Library, they should go silently in single file without disturbing the neighboring classes and keeping to the left. Running, lying or shouting inside the school building is not allowed.
- 6.15 'Cleanliness is next to Godliness.' Students should take pride in keeping the school premises clean. They are not to destroy any plants or flowers or litter the place with paper bits, etc.
- 6.16 Students are to collect Mid-day meal coupons before 9.15 a.m.
- 6.17 Students must converse only on English with the staff and fellow mates. If found talking in vernacular languages, then a fine will be levied.
- 6.18 No form of jewellery is allowed with the uniform such as bangles, long ear-rings, chains, finger rings, anklets, etc. Girls may wear only a pair of small studs.
- 6.19 There will be surprise-checking of bags by the teachers at regular intervals.

7. SCHOOL DIARY

- 7.1 The school diary must be brought to the school daily.
- 7.2 Appreciation for any good deeds done will be recorded and recognized.
- 7.3 A record of coming late/untidy turnout/ homework not done/ misbehavior will be maintained in the diary.

8. RAGGING/BULLYING

- 8.1 Ragging/Bullying is a punishable offence. Bullying can be directly from the bully to the victim (e.g., through physical intimidation

or attacks, verbal abuse, unwanted attention and advances, damaging property), or it can be indirect (e.g., through spreading malicious rumors)

- 8.2 Students subjected to it must report to the class teacher immediately. Utmost care and stringent action will be taken on the culprits as per the CBSE norms.
- 8.3 Students should maintain a respectable distance with their teachers and fellow mates.
- 8.4 Students fighting in the classroom, corridors, staircases or anywhere in school premises will be given initial warning by the class teacher. If repeated, the matter will be reported to the Principal and disciplinary action will be taken.
- 8.5 Sexual harassment which includes unwelcome sexual advances, request for sexual favours, passing of lewd comments and body shaming will be considered a major offence and serious action will be taken to the extent of suspension/dismissal.
- 8.6 Students using abusive language and showing disrespect to their teachers will be dealt with seriously.

9. OPEN HOUSE AND INTERACTIVE SESSIONS

- 9.1 The Open House Day gives an opportunity for a meaningful exchange of views between parents and teachers to bring about better understanding of the students' progress.
- 9.2 Parents must attend the Open House along with their wards. Students must come in full uniform.
- 9.3 In case of unforeseen circumstances, the parents who cannot make it for the 'Open House Day' must meet the subject teachers on the following Saturday between 9.30 a.m. to 12.00 p.m.

10. BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

- 10.1 All students are welcome to celebrate their birthdays in school. They will be greeted during the assembly. Students are allowed to wear birthday outfits. They are expected to dress modestly on their birthdays. No sleeveless outfits are allowed.
- 10.2 To make the birthday celebration meaningful you are free to contribute for the birthday fund which will be used for needy.

11. TRANSPORT

- 11.1 Students are requested to keep to the School vehicle timings.
- 11.2 Parents / students shall not attempt to stop the buses in any other place than their own designated stops.
- 11.3 No student is permitted to change his/her bus or stop at any time without the request by the parents addressed to the Principal. If any student misbehaves in the bus his/her bus facility will be suspended.
- 11.4 Parents of small children shall accompany the child and help the child board the bus in the morning, and receive the child in the evenings. Parents are requested to keep to the vehicle timings.
- 11.5 Children have a tendency to run as soon as they get down from the bus. Parents of small children are, therefore, requested to come and hold the child, when they alight from the bus, and move forward or go across the road, only after the school bus has left. This is very important from the point of view of safety.
- 11.6 Parents are not allowed to travel by school vehicles or accompany the children in the school vehicles.
